Low Hanging Fruit Update

- Tenisio, Sissie, and Chelsea toured some city-owned vacant properties
 - Potential demonstration project sites
 - Potential education project sites
 - City parks
 - Sissie to upload map of sites to shared Google Drive
- Tenisio, Denise, and Holmes discussed community survey data
 - Call with Sarah regarding Holmes' draft survey
 - What version can we distribute out to the community? Petition vs. survey
- Market 166 update from Permeil
 - Undertaking feasibility survey
 - Looking at sites based on location, size, and affordability
 - Looking to expand membership from 120 to 300 to move forward
 - 50% discount for any Steering Committee members
 - Discussion of what a cooperative is and how it serves the community
 - Owned by community members, pooling resources to form a board with voting rights
 - Control over food sourcing and purchasing
 - See Sevenanda as an example
 - Need to expand Board of Directors from 6 to 9-11

Draft Plan - Preliminary Recommendations

- Tenisio need more detail on policy and project recommendations
 - Sam this is a framework document that will get fleshed out a little more with detail
 - Using the SC, identify short term strategies to tackle within the next 2 years
 - Implementation phase ideas on how to address specific short term strategies

Improving Access

- Develop a corner store incentive program (long-term)
 - Permeil expand to incentives for grocery stores and mobile markets
- Leverage existing farm-to-school educational opportunities (ongoing)
- Maps, studies, data will be linked in appendices in final plan

Supporting Local Growers

Sissie – add incentive programs for Seniors specifically

- Holmes basic resources for growers ie. Leaves, compost, etc.
- Erin corner store incentive program
 - Looking at REAP program established a separate entity
 - Urban Ag. Citizen's Commission key to feasibility of projects
- Dom City of East Point power department has a tree chipper that could provide wood chips for farmers
- Chelsea could one of those vacant properties be a dump ground/pick up location for brown materials?
- Tenisio see model in DeKalb county for compost that's part of their solid waste system

Role of Local Government

- Maceo need to focus on prioritizing ideas before presenting to Mayor and Council
 - Other ways to raise funding, source best practices from communities comparable in size to East Point
 - Revenues are down just like everywhere else
 - Reliant on tourism for source of revenue ie. Taste of East Point, Wednesday Wind Down, etc.
 - Will work on setting an additional meeting with Kim & Tony regarding zoning/permitting
- Is 1-2 years a realistic "short term" goal timeline?
- Tenisio added full Urban Agriculture ordinance from city of Atlanta to Google Drive to use as reference

Cultivating Environmentally Resilient Practices

- Centralized compost program
 - Vs. curbside compost program
 - Tenisio encourage public/private partnership with entity like Compost Now

o Branding East Point as a Local Food Destination

- Denise look at free, existing marketing opportunities ie. Information included with utility bills
- Chelsea need branding for urban ag initiatives
 - Balance of branding with umbrella concept vs. individual organizations
 - Encourage simplicity
